

Conjunctions

Conjunctions are the words that join sentences together to make a conversation flow more easily. Sometimes conjunctions are called 'connectors' or link words or 'joining words'. Some examples of conjunctions are:

and	because	but	so
or	while	if	then
as	when	instead	unless
although	before	however	otherwise
neither	until	after	since
therefore	for	whatever	yet
meanwhile	next	once	though

Your child needs to fully understand each of these words before they can be expected to use them correctly. At first, you will need to give good examples of conjunctions. Emphasise the conjunction words when you use them.

Try these activities:

These activities allow your child to hear lots of good examples of conjunctions. Don't worry if they don't start to use them straight away or if they use them incorrectly to start with. Just keep trying.

Everyday chat Talk about familiar routines e.g. "you had breakfast **and** then you brushed your teeth." Encourage your child to talk about events in the order they happened by asking "what did you do first?...and then..."

Books Give examples of the conjunction you are working on e.g. "Goldilocks moved onto the next bowl of porridge **because** it was too hot" or "The boy is sad **because** he hurt himself".

Simon says type games

Use the conjunction you are working on. e.g. "Simon says touch your nose but don't jump up and down". "**If** you find two pictures that match, clap your hands". "**If** I jump up and down, you touch your nose". "Jump in the red hoops **but** not in the blue hoops".

Allow your child to give you instructions as well.





